Peter Troost Team Wins Faehnle Trophy

Two talented individuals teamed up to win the Eugene H. Faehnle, FAICA Trophy awarded this past October during AICA's Annual Meeting in San Diego, California. The team of Jack Hallihan and Beverly Christofaro, both designers for Peter Troost Monument Company, Hillside, Illinois, designed the KERN memorial, which took first place in the Family Monuments category and won Best of Show winning the coveted Faehnle Trophy to display in their office for the next year.



"The customer wanted to incorporate doves into the monument's design. This was their main concern. We chose to have a flock of doves sculptured in a position to reflect a rising together skyward," the designers said. A more traditional shape was selected allowing all features to focus on the beautiful sculpture.


Beverly Christofaro works at one of Peter Troost's branch offices in the Chicago area and the initial sketch for this monument's concept was hers.
